

RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 278868

ADOPTED ON OCT 2 1 1991

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that pursuant to City Charter Section 43(b) the City Council hereby establishes a citizens advisory committee to be known as the "Balboa Park Citizens Action Committee."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Balboa Park Citizens Action Committee shall coordinate its activities with the Park and Recreation Board and said board's subcommittees and shall be advisory to the City Manager and the City Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Attachment A to this resolution is a copy of a condensed listing of the objectives of the "Heart of the City Action Plan," which objectives shall be within the advisory purview of the Balboa Park Citizens Action Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Attachment B hereto outlines the proposed work program and time frame of the Balboa Park Citizens Action Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the committee membership shall initially consist of those 49 individuals listed on Attachment C hereto, and the City Manager is hereby authorized to appoint replacements for any of the 49 persons as vacancies occur, and the City Manager is further authorized to appoint additional individuals to the committee as may from time-to-time be determined to be appropriate.



"Heart of the City Action Plan"

Balboa Park Task Force

Revised August 1991

A. Security and Safety

1. Discourage and eliminate the feeding programs for the homeless in Balboa Park.
2. Start an organization named "Balboa Park Citizens Action Committee" to find more funding and encourage additional use of the Park.
3. Target hours for police enforcement efforts.
4. Regulate alcohol use.
5. Expand Park Ranger program.
6. Expand Park watch and community awareness programs.
7. Enhance youth diversion recreation programs.
8. Emphasize Park design criteria promoting public safety.
9. Provide adequate lighting in plazas, parking lots, along primary pedestrian routes and areas of nighttime activity.
10. Provide a greater perceived presence of security personnel.
11. Provide staffed "security booths" in parking structures.
12. Provide a greater presence of equestrian police patrols in canyons.
13. Provide access for emergency vehicles and emergency assistance in remote areas of the Park.
14. Continue the Police Storefront in the Park.
15. Design and implement a restroom security plan.
16. Increase Police surveillance and enforcement in high-crime areas.
17. Eliminate transient camps.
18. Implement traffic circulation controls to diminish "cruising."

19. Design park roadsides and street ends to prevent illegal off-road activities.
20. Increase active uses of all facilities on the West Side.

B. Social Services and Housing

1. Establish small regional centers for health care ("Sanctuary").
2. Establish rehabilitated housing for women and children to learn independent living skills (12 houses for each group).
3. Establish 75-120 beds to treat homeless substance abusers with detoxification, as well as short and long-term recovery services.
4. Fund and implement a day & night 24-hour court on a trial basis for immediate arraignment of misdemeanants and non-violent felons.
5. Provide more jail space.
6. Provide HIV screening and support services.

2.	Eliminate feeding programs at Balboa Park.  a. Meet with representatives of churches/groups providing meals.  b. Discussion of options, including a review of ramifications of relocating meal programs to other sites.  c. Recommend action for City to consider.	Oct-Dec '91
3.	Rehabilitate 20 homes for transitional housing.  a. Lease from City, acquire rehabilitation from private industry, and turn over to private non-profit agencies for management.  b. Distribution: 2 for mental health, 4 for sober living environment, 6 for women, 6 for children, and 2 for gay/lesbian population.	Oct '91-Mar '92
4.	Increase presence of Police Department at Balboa Park.  a. Meet with Police Department representatives to review current allocation of PD resources in the Park.  b. Discussion of options, including a review of fiscal implications.  c. Recommend action for City to consider.	Jan-Mar '92
