ADOPTED ON MAR 16 1992

AN ORDINANCE INCORPORATING VARIOUS PROPERTIES LOCATED IN THE SAN YSIDRO, OTAY MESA-NESTOR AND TIJUANA RIVER VALLEY COMMUNITY PLAN AREAS, IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA, FROM A-1-1 AND A-1-10 ZONES INTO R1-5000, CT-2 AND CT-3 ZONES, AS DEFINED BY SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER X, ARTICLE 1, DIVISION 4, AND CHAPTER X, ARTICLE 3, DIVISION 22, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 7606 (NEW SERIES), ADOPTED SEPTEMBER 26, 1956; AND ORDINANCE NO. 10862 (NEW SERIES), ADOPTED JULY 29, 1972, OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO INSOFAR AS THE SAME CONFLICT HEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That various properties located in the San Ysidro Community Plan area, in the City of San Diego, California, within the boundary of the district designated "A-1-1 and A-1-10" on Zone Map Drawing No. C-843.2, filed in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. C-843.2, be, and they are hereby incorporated into R1-5000, CT-2 and CT-3 zones, as such zones are described and defined by San Diego Municipal Code Chapter X, Article 1, Division 4, and Chapter X, Article 3, Division 22.

Section 2. That Ordinance No. 7606 (New Series), adopted September 26, 1956; and Ordinance No. 10862 (New Series), adopted July 29, 1972, of the ordinances of The City of San Diego be and they are repealed insofar as the same conflict herewith.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage, however, the

provisions of this ordinance shall not be applicable within the Coastal Zone until the thirtieth day following the date the California Coastal Commission unconditionally certifies this ordinance as a local coastal program amendment. If this ordinance is not certified, or is certified with suggested modifications by the California Coastal Commission, the provisions of this ordinance shall be null and void within the Coastal Zone.

Section 4. In areas of the City of San Diego other than the Coastal Zone, any project meeting either of the criteria set forth below, and submitted prior to <u>MAR 161992</u>, the date of adoption of this ordinance, shall be exempt from the provisions of this ordinance.

- A. Any project for which plans have been submitted to the Building Inspection Department of The City of San Diego, which plans comply with the minimum requirement as established by the Building Inspection Department.
- B. Any project for which plans have been submitted for a discretionary permit (or permits) subject to Chapter X of the San Diego Municipal Code; provided, however, that all plans submitted to the Building Inspection Department shall be consistent with the approved discretionary permit or permits.

Section 5. Within the Coastal Zone, no permits for development inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance shall be issued after the date on which this ordinance become effective within the Coastal Zone, as specified in Section 3 of

this ordinance, unless an application for a Coastal Development Permit was made prior to MAR 161992, the date of adoption of this ordinance.

## ORDINANCE NUMBER 0-17747 (NEW SERIES) AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER II, ARTICLE 2, DIVING SION 5, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 22.0506, 22.0512 AND 22.0514 RELATING TO SELLING AND DISPOSING OF OBSOLETE OR DEPRECIATED PROPERTY, AWARD OF PROCUREMENT AND PUBLIC WORKS CONTRACTS, AND DEBARMENT PROCEDURES FOR PROCUREMENT AND PUBLIC WORKS CONTRACTS It is proposed that San Diego Municipal Code ("SDMC") section 22,0506 be amended to allow for the disposition of selected surplus property through the San Diego City Store or its successor. Additional amendments are proposed to the first paragraph of this section to refine and delete ambiguities in its language. Amendments to the second and third paragraphs of this section are proposed in order to clarify the Purchasing Agent's responsibilities regarding the disposition of surplus property. The amendments to the first paragraph of SDMC section 22,0512 was proposed for clarification purposes. Additional amendments are proposed to provide for mechanism by which the City Manager and the Purphasing Agent can expeditiously process the award of contracts. The amendments provide a deadline for the submittal of insurance and bond documents on construction and non-professional service contracts. The amendments permit the City Manager and the Purchasing Agent to reached a contract and sweard to the next low bidder when the contractor, fails to mest the specified deadlines for submittal of bond and insurance documents. The proposed amendment to SDMC section 22,0514 establishes an additional ground for debarment. Specifically, it is proposed that a contractor may be dectared ineligible to bid on City procurement and public works contracts for a period of three (3) years if a contractor on two or more occasions within a two-year period falls to submit bond or insurance documents acceptable to the City.
