RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 280310

ADOPTED ON JUL 07 1992

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DETERMINING THAT THE USE OF FUNDS FROM THE COLUMBIA LOW AND MODERATE INCOME HOUSING FUND TO PAY PART OF THE COST OF REHABILITATING THE HOUSING UNDER A PROPOSED HOUSING REHABILITATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AND SAN DIEGO YOUTH AND COMMUNITY SERVICES WILL BE OF BENEFIT TO THE COLUMBIA REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Agency of The City of San Diego (the "Agency") is engaged in activities necessary to carry out and implement the Redevelopment Plan for the Columbia Redevelopment Project (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Agency proposed to provide financial assistance for the rehabilitation of certain real property and existing building and related facilities to provide housing for very low income persons that is of benefit to the Project area pursuant to the terms and provisions of a Housing Rehabilitation Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Centre City Development Corporation, Inc., has reviewed and discussed said proposed Housing Rehabilitation Agreement and has recommended that the Agency enter into the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes the proposed agreement is in the best interest of the City and the health, safety, morals and welfare of its residents, and in accord with the public


purposes and provisions of applicable State and local laws and requirements; and

WHEREAS, as part of carrying out the Project, the Agency has established the Columbia Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund, and has and will deposit funds therein as provided by the California Community Redevelopment Law (Health and Safety Code section 33000 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Agency desires to use funds from the Columbia Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund to pay part of the cost of rehabilitating housing under the Housing Rehabilitation Agreement for very low income persons; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the Council finds and determines that, based upon the information set forth in Attachment No. 1 (attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference), the use of funds from the Columbia Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund as authorized by this resolution will be of benefit to the Project.

BENEFIT TO THE PROJECT AREA

The use of funds from the Columbia Redevelopment Project Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund to provide for the rehabilitation of property known as The Bridge located at 3151 Redwood Street, San Diego, as transitional housing for very low income persons, will be of benefit to the Project in that:

- The rehabilitation of The Bridge will allow for the treatment annually of approximately 114 individuals or households of very low income.
- Approximately 8.8% of the clients served at The Bridge either live in the downtown area or were picked up on the streets of downtown San Diego.
- The Bridge is located approximately three miles northeast of the Columbia Redevelopment Project. By providing such a shelter facility, persons who are homeless, abused or substance abusers and who frequent the Project area, will be provided a facility whereby they can be treated for their substance abuse by living in a sober, clean, drug-free environment and receive counseling for their addiction and/or emotional problems.
- Funds from the Columbia Redevelopment Project Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund will enable the Redevelopment Agency to assist the San Diego Youth and Community Services to rehabilitate the 8-bed facility. The Redevelopment Project will benefit by providing very low income housing facilities with a program to specifically serve a component of the population that is under-served and whose anti-social behavior has been a detriment to the Project area.
