WHEREAS, the President of the United States has proclaimed September 18, 1992 as National POW/MIA Recognition Day; and

WHEREAS, public awareness of this issue signals other governments that we are determined to account for our missing women and men; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego that, to honor those military men and women who have returned and to ensure that those who are missing are not forgotten, this Council, for on behalf of the people of San Diego, hereby proclaims September 21, 1992 as "CITY OF SAN DIEGO POW/MIA RECOGNITION DAY."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the POW/MIA flag will fly over the proceedings of the September 21, 1992 City Council meeting.
