Residential Development Ordinance; adoption of an interim
development impact fee; and amendments to Council Policies 600-29
and 600-30 dealing with requirements for development in the
Future Urbanizing Area; and

WHEREAS, the Framework Plan does not include concurrent adoption of a public facilities financing plan for needed capital improvements within the subject planning area; and

WHEREAS, the Council of The City of San Diego has considered all maps, exhibits and written documents contained in the file for this project on record in The City of San Diego, and has considered all oral presentations given at the public hearings; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that it hereby adopts the North City Future Urbanizing Area Framework Plan ("Framework Plan"), a copy of which is on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR 28078.7-1

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Citizen Advisory Committee ("CAC") Policy Issues set forth on Attachment A and the errata sheet, Attachment B, are incorporated into the Framework Plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council hereby adopts amendments to the Open Space and Transportation Elements of the *Progress Guide and General Plan* as depicted on Figure 3.2 in the Framework Plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council hereby adopts amendments to the Guidelines for Future Development section of the Progress Guide and General Plan, a copy of which is on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR-280787.2

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council hereby adopts amendments to the *Progress Guide and General Plan* for The City of San Diego by incorporating the proposed North City Future Urbanizing Area Framework Plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall not become effective within the areas of the City within the jurisdiction of the California Coastal Commission until such time as the Commission unconditionally certifies these amendments as a Local Coastal Program amendment.






