AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER V, ARTICLE 5, DIVISION 3, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING SECTION 55.0310.0401; BY AMENDING CHAPTER V, ARTICLE 5, DIVISION 4, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING SECTION 55.0425.0502; AND BY AMENDING CHAPTER V, ARTICLE 5, DIVISION 7, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING SECTION 55.0780.0103 ALL RELATING TO THE UNIFORM FIRE CODE, 1991 EDITION.

WHEREAS, May 18, 1993, has been declared "Regulatory Relief Day"; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of Regulatory Relief Day is to streamline and consolidate where appropriate the City's regulatory procedures; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Department has reviewed the 1991 Edition of the Uniform Fire Code which this City has adopted in Chapter V, Article 5, of the San Diego Municipal Code and has suggested adopting three (3) sections of the 1991 Uniform Fire Code with changes that will streamline the regulatory process; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of The City of San Diego finds and declares that the recommended additions to the San Diego
Municipal Code incorporate changes and modifications reasonably necessary because of present local conditions; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter V, Article 5, Division 3, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by adding Section 55.0310.0401, to read as follows:

### SEC. 55.0310.0401 WATER SUPPLIES FOR FIRE PROTECTION

U.F.C. (1991 Edition) is adopted with changes to read as follows:

An approved water supply capable of supplying the required fire flow for fire protection shall be provided to all premises upon which facilities, buildings, or portions of buildings are hereafter constructed or moved into or within the jurisdiction. When any portion of the facility or building protected is in excess of three hundred (300) feet from a water supply on a public street, as measured by an approved route around the exterior of the facility or building, on-site fire hydrants and mains capable of supplying the required fire flow shall be provided when required by the Fire Chief.

Section 2. That Chapter V, Article 5, Division 4, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by adding Section 55.0425.0502, to read as follows:

### SEC. 55.0425.0502 DISPLAYS

U.F.C. 25.502 (1991 Edition) is adopted with changes to read as follows:

- (a) General no change.
- (b) Batteries no change.
- (c) Fuel systems

- (1) Fueling no change.
- (2) Quantity limit. Fuel in the fuel tank shall not exceed one quarter of the tank capacity or five (5) gallons, whichever is less.

Exception: Fuel in a fuel tank which is classified as a combustible liquid shall not exceed one quarter of the tank capacity when vehicles containing such fuel are displayed in buildings fully protected with an automatic fire sprinkler system.

- (3) Inspection no change.
- (4) Closure no change.
- (d) Location no change.

Section 3. That Chapter V, Article 5, Division 7, of the San Diego Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended by adding Section 55.0780.0103, to read as follows:

## SEC. 55.0780.0103 PERMITS

U.F.C. 80.103 (1991 Edition) is adopted with changes to read as follows:

- (a) General no change.
- (b) Hazardous Materials Management Plan no change.
- (c) Hazardous Materials Inventory Statement. When required by the Fire Chief, each application for a permit shall include a Hazardous Material Inventory Statement ("HMIS").

Exception: If a HMIS is on file and there has been no inventory changes which would render the HMIS on record as inaccurate, then a new HMIS need not be submitted if

permittee signs a statement certifying that the HMIS on file is accurate.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtjeth day from and after its passage.

Section 55.0310.0401 adopts U.F.C. section 10.401 with changes pertaining to the number of fire hydrants required on certain premises.

Section 55.0425.0502 adopts U.F.C. section 25.502 with changes pertaining to fuel tank capacity for vehicles used for display purposes in buildings.
