WHEREAS, Bill was an advocate for the San Diego Hospice, working to obtain land for the new building and assisting the hospice in maneuvering through zoning problems and in obtaining funding; and

WHEREAS, Bill always conducted himself with grace and candor and was respected by his colleagues, many of whom are privileged

to count him as a friend; and

WHEREAS, Bill fought especially hard for funding for the construction of the ball fields and comfort station at Collier Park East; and

WHEREAS, Bill's many efforts have not been adequately acknowledged by The City of San Diego; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council does hereby thank and commend Bill Cleator for his many contributions to The City of San Diego.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Collier Park East be renamed as of this day as "BILL CLEATOR PARK" in his honor.
