WHEREAS, Public Law 101-510, Title XXIX required the Secretary of Defense to submit a list of proposed military base closures and realignments to the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission on March 15, 1993; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has scheduled a public hearing in San Diego on April 27, 1993; and

WHEREAS, on July 1, 1993, after holding public hearings, the Commission will transmit its recommendations to President Clinton; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary of Defense included the closure of Naval Training Center San Diego (NTC) in his recommendation to the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the closure of NTC, which generates an economic impact of over \$100 million, would be a serious financial setback to San Diego at a time the region can least afford it; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary of Defense also proposed to retain Long Beach Naval Shipyard; and

WHEREAS, San Diego's private sector ship repair and ship building industry, which generates almost 10,000 jobs and \$650 million in economic activity, will be significantly impacted by the Commission's decisions affecting naval shipyards; and

WHEREAS, the man-day labor rate in private shipyards is

approximately \$300 per day compared to \$500 per day in the public sector shipyards; and

WHEREAS, it is in the national interest to maintain the economic health of the more cost effective private sector ship building and repair industry; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council does hereby express its support for the retention of Naval Training Center San Diego.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Council hereby requests that the Commission take into account the impact on the private sector ship building and repair industry when considering the disposition of Navy shipyards.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Director of Legislative Services is directed to communicate with and provide a copy of this resolution to San Diego's congressional delegation and to the City's legislative advocates in Washington, D.C.
