AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER II, ARTICLE 6, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY REPEALING DIVISION 12, AND SECTIONS 26.1201, 26.1202 AND 26.1203, ALL PERTAINING TO THE CITY'S ELECTIONS, CAMPAIGN AND GOVERNMENTAL ETHICS ADVISORY BOARD.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter II, Article 6, of the San Diego Municipal Code is hereby amended by repealing Division 12, and Sections 26.1201, 26.1202 and 26.1203.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage.

~~It is the purpose and intent of the City
Council to establish an Elections, Campaign
and Governmental Ethics Advisory Board to
serve as an advisory body to the Mayor, City
Council, City Clerk and City Manager on
policy issues relating to the City's
elections, campaign financing and
governmental ethics.~~

~~§ 26.1202 Elections, Campaign and Governmental
Ethics Advisory Board Established~~

~~There is hereby created an Elections,
Campaign and Governmental Ethics Advisory
Board consisting of fifteen (15) members, who
shall serve without compensation. The
members shall be appointed by the Mayor and
confirmed by the Council.~~

~~The members shall serve three (3) year terms and each member shall serve until a successor is duly appointed and confirmed. The members shall be appointed such that the terms of not more than five (5) members shall expire in any year. The expiration date of all terms shall be February 1. During February of each year, the Mayor may designate one (1) member as Chairperson; however, in the absence of such designation, the Board shall on or after March 15, select a Chairperson from among its members. Any vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term of the member whose place becomes vacant. If a vacancy occurs, a replacement shall be appointed in the same manner as for initial appointments. The Board shall adopt rules consistent with the law for the government of its business and procedures.~~

~~§ 26.1203 Duties and Functions~~

~~The Board shall:~~

~~(a) Review local and state laws and policies regarding elections, including campaign finance, campaign disclosure, governmental ethics, and conflict of interest.~~

~~(b) Provide advice and recommendations to the Mayor, City Council, City Clerk and~~

~~City Manager on policy issues related to elections, campaign and governmental ethics, including recommending proposed amendments to existing state and local legislation and policy.~~

~~(c) Conduct a systematic review of Conflict of Interest Codes for City Departments, City Commissions, Advisory Boards and City-owned Corporations.~~
