

RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 283296

ADOPTED ON JAN 18 1994

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO  
DECLARING A CONTINUED STATE OF EMERGENCY  
REGARDING THE DISCHARGE OF RAW SEWAGE  
FROM TIJUANA, MEXICO.

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8630 authorizes local governing bodies to proclaim local emergencies when such events occur as are defined by Section 8558(c), provided further by Section 8630 that the local governing body must review such a state of emergency every fourteen (14) days until the local emergency is declared terminated; and

WHEREAS, on September 7, 1993, the Council of The City of San Diego adopted Resolution No. R-282544 declaring the existence of a state of emergency relating to the escalated discharge of sewage across the international border into the City of San Diego from Tijuana, Mexico, and after a legislative recess declared a continued state of emergency on September 27, 1993 by Resolution No. R-282697; and

WHEREAS, the Council declared a continued state of emergency during the Council meetings of October 11, 1993, October 25, 1993, November 8, 1993, November 29, 1993, and after legislative recess on January 4, 1994; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that pursuant to Section 8630 of the California Government Code, a continued state of emergency is declared to persist relative to the escalated discharge of raw sewage from Tijuana, Mexico.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Manager is authorized to execute all necessary contracts for the diversion, treatment and disposal of international raw sewage.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the measures previously taken by the Council in Resolution No. R-282544 shall continue to have full force and effect.
