## RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 284067 ADOPTED ON JUN 20 1994

WHEREAS, following the success of the 1993's inaugural National Trails Day in which more than 750,000 outdoor enthusiasts attended 2,500 public events from coast-to-coast, as many as 3,000 organizations are working in partnership for the Second Annual National Trails Day; and

WHEREAS, San Diego County will be working to preserve such trails as Sweetwater Summit Park in Bonita, California Riding and Hiking Trail in Alpine, Mission Trails Regional Park in San Diego, and Santee Boulders in Santee, by removing graffiti, garbage and junk that detract from the natural beauty; and

WHEREAS, the event is coordinated nationwide by the American Hiking Society (AHS) and locally by trail clubs, municipal park authorities and other land management agencies, outdoor business and conservation organizations; and

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council, for and on behalf of the people of San Diego, hereby commends the American Hiking Society for their commitment and dedication to preserving and expanding America's trails, and American volunteerism, because a majority of the nation's 300,000 miles of trails are maintained by volunteer crews.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that June 4, 1994 be and is hereby proclaimed to be "SECOND ANNUAL NATIONAL TRAILS DAY" in The City of San Diego.
