RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 284068

ADOPTED ON JUN 20 1994

WHEREAS, the Tierrasanta community was once part of Camp Elliott, a military reservation that operated a tank, anti-tank and artillery training and practice range during World War II and the Korean War; and

WHEREAS, in 1968 private developers acquired the Tierrasanta area where more than 10,000 homes have since been built; and

WHEREAS, at the urging of several elected officials, including then Congressman Bill Lowery and then City Councilman Dick Murphy, and many community leaders, the federal government began to address the issue of removing unexploded ordnance from Tierrasanta; and

WHEREAS, in 1990 the United States Army Corps of Engineers awarded a contract to the Environmental Chemical Corporation for the removal of ordnance from the open areas in Tierrasanta; and


WHEREAS, during the course of the project, more than 3,900 small caliber shells and 1,000 high explosive shells were unearthed from areas of open space in Tierrasanta; NOW,

does hereby commend the United States Army Corps of Engineers for its management of the Ordnance Removal Project in Tierrasanta.
