# RESOLUTION NUMBER R-284251 ADOPTED ON JUL 11 1994

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ON JUNE 7, 1994.

WHEREAS, a special municipal election was held in The City of San Diego on Tuesday, June 7, 1994, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. O-18050 (New Series), adopted March 8, 1994, which Special Municipal Election was called for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of The City of San Diego two (2) propositions: One proposition to amend Section 12 of the Charter of The City of San Diego pertaining to Council vacancies (Proposition B); and one proposition to amend The City of San Diego's Progress Guide and General Plan (Proposition C), as follows:

#### PROPOSITION B

PROPOSITION B. AMENDS THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO BY AMENDING SECTION 12.	YES	
Enables the City Council to fill a vacant seat on the Council by appointment if the vacancy occurs with one (1) year or less remaining in the term; or to call a special election if the vacancy occurs with more than one (1) year remaining in the term.	NO	

PROPOSITION C. AMENDS THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO'S PROGRESS GUIDE AND GENERAL PLAN.	YES	
Imposes development controls and changes the designation of the North City Future Urbanizing Area.	NO

WHEREAS, a copy of the certificate of the Registrar of
Voters of San Diego County canvassing the returns of the special
municipal election, as certified to the City Clerk, has been duly
received; and

WHEREAS, a canvass of this election has been completed and the City Clerk has certified the results to the City Council; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the Council finds and determines pursuant to the provisions of Section 27.2206 of the San Diego Municipal Code, as follows:

Ι

The whole number of votes cast in the City was 205,386.

II

The number of votes cast in the City for and against each of the two (2) propositions which appeared on the ballot as Propositions B and C and the total number of votes cast upon each such proposition is as follows:

#### PROPOSITION B

Against 73,887
TOTAL 166,498

Proposition B received the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified voters voting on such proposition and is hereby declared to have been approved.

Proposition C did not receive the affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified voters voting on such proposition and is hereby declared to have failed.
