

RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 285207

ADOPTED ON JAN 17 1995

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE APPLICATION FOR LAND
AND WATER CONSERVATION FUNDS FOR THE FLORIDA
CANYON TRAIL SYSTEM RESTORATION PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Congress under Public Law 88-578 has authorized the establishment of a Federal Land Water Conservation Fund Grant-in-Aid Program, providing matching funds to the State of California and its political subdivisions for acquiring lands and developing facilities for public outdoor recreation purposes; and

WHEREAS, the State Department of Parks and Recreation is responsible for the administration of the program within the State, setting up necessary rules and procedures governing application by local agencies under the program; and

WHEREAS, said adopted procedures established by the State Department of Parks and Recreation require the applicant to certify by resolution the approval of applications and the availability of local matching funds prior to submission of said applications to the State; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Florida Canyon Trail System Restoration and Revitalization Project is consistent with the Statewide Comprehensive Recreation Resources Plan: California Outdoor Recreation Plan - 1994; and

WHEREAS, the project must be compatible with the land use plans of those jurisdictions immediately surrounding the project;
NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego as follows:

1. That the Council hereby approves the filing of applications for Land and Water Conservation Fund assistance.

2. That the Council hereby certifies that it has matching funds from the following source: Capital Outlay Fund, and certifies that it can finance one hundred percent (100%) of the project, with up to fifty percent (50%) reimbursement.


3. That the Council hereby certifies that the project is compatible with land use plans for the jurisdictions immediately surrounding the project.

4. That the Council hereby appoints the City Manager, or his representative, as agent of the City of San Diego to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents, including but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments and billing statements, which may be necessary for the completion of this project.

5. That the City Auditor and Comptroller is hereby authorized to establish a separate interest earning fund for the grant if funded.
