<u>Engineering</u>, and has written many articles for publication; and

WHEREAS, on July 1, 1985, Dr. Jacobs became a founder and the Chairman and CEO of QUALCOMM, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, he has led QUALCOMM through a period of rapid growth to over 1700 employees, and international activities in mobile satellite communications and digital wireless telephony; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Jacobs is deserving of recognition for his extraordinary achievements in the commercialization of technology which resulted in his being awarded the 1994 National Medal of Technology; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council, for and on behalf of the people of San Diego, does hereby recognize Dr. Irwin M. Jacobs for his contributions to commercialization of technology and his recent honor as recipient of the National Medal of Technology.
