## RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 285485 ADOPTED ON MAR 20 1995

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development has selected the San Diego Housing Authority for a continuation of the existing Drug Elimination Program which operates in public and subsidized housing areas throughout San Diego, and;

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego Police Department wishes to enter into an agreement to participate in the Drug Elimination Grant by providing community policing services in public and subsidized housing in Eastern and Southern Divisions, and to accept and expend grant funds designated for such services by the San Diego Housing Authority, and;

WHEREAS, target areas, officer duties and responsibilities, terms of reimbursement and other details are identical to those which have existed under the Drug Elimination Grant for the past two (2) years; however, a modification in the funding year of the Department of Housing and Urban Development resulted in a gap in grant funding of three months (during which time costs for the officers were provided by the San Diego Housing Authority) which causes this to be a new grant and contract issue; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the City Manager be and is hereby authorized and empowered, for and on behalf of the City of San Diego, to enter into an agreement (a copy of the draft of which is on file in the Office

of the City Clerk as Document No. RR- 285485) with the San Diego Housing Authority to provide services of two (2) police officers in the execution of grant program activities, goals, and objectives, and to accept payment for the salaries and benefits for same;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to execute all aspects of program operation including any amendments, extensions, renewals, or future funding for this program for a period of up to five (5) years, provided funding is made available by the San Diego Housing Authority, and to certify that the City will comply with all applicable statutory or regulatory requirements related to said program;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resources received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that personnel positions funded under this grant program are not subject to local hiring freezes.
