

RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 285643

ADOPTED ON APR 24 1995

WHEREAS, Mayor Golding discussed the concept of a link from San Diego Bay to Mission Bay in her State of the City Address on January 13, 1994; and

WHEREAS, on August 8, 1994, the City Council authorized the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Adele Santos of the UCSD School of Architecture to study the Bay-to-Bay link; and

WHEREAS, the Bay-to-Bay link was studied by Adele Santos and a team of architects, planners, and technical advisors over the course of three weekend-long workshops; and

WHEREAS, the public input received at public workshops has been generally supportive of the concept of linking the two bays; and

WHEREAS, more public outreach and focussed planning is needed to evaluate the support for, feasibility, and cost of a Bay-to-Bay link; NOW, THEREFORE,


BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the Council hereby accepts the report of the Bay-to-Bay workshops and commends the work done to date and directs the City Manager to continue a Bay-to-Bay public outreach effort, particularly in the impacted communities, and to develop a planning framework for an implementation strategy.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council hereby urges the United States Navy to expedite its NTC Declaration of Surplus.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the question of beginning the redevelopment process and determining the project area for redevelopment of the Midway/Rosecrans area, is hereby directed to the NTC Reuse Committee, with the Committee to also make recommendations of whether or not this redevelopment should take place independent of the Bay-to-Bay project so that redevelopment takes place as soon as feasible, even if the Bay-to-Bay project is slowed by unforeseen impediments.
