

RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 285851

ADOPTED ON MAY 30 1995

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATIONS TO THE NATIONAL HISTORIC PRESERVATION FUND SUBGRANT PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the United States Congress, under Public Law 89-665 has authorized the establishment of the National Historic Preservation Grants-in-Aid Program (the "Program") which provides matching funds to states and their eligible subdivisions, to promote historic preservation objectives, including surveys, registration of eligible structures, training, and education; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation for the State of California is responsible for the administration of the Program within California, and for setting up rules and procedures that govern the applications of the Program; and

WHEREAS, the procedures adopted by the Department of Parks and Recreation require applicants to certify by resolution that the applicant formally approves submission of the application, and that forty percent (40%) local matching funds or in-kind services will be pledged to the activity(s) that is the subject of the application; and

WHEREAS, The City of San Diego, as a Certified Local Government, is an eligible subdivision of the State of California; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

1. That the City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized to file an application and execute all necessary documents in connection therewith, for the National Historic Preservation Grants-in-Aid Program, for the following projects to be administered on behalf of the City by the Planning Department:

a. The printing and distribution of a four-color map of the City of San Diego which indicates where historic sites and districts are located, contains descriptive graphics, photographs, and other written information which would be of interest to residents and tourists in the City. It is anticipated that this would be the first of an on-going series of informative documents regarding historic resources in San Diego and its individual communities. This would be a ten thousand dollar (\$10,000) project, in which six thousand dollars (\$6,000) would come from the Program, and the City's forty percent (40%) match of four thousand dollars (\$4,000) would consist of in-kind services to be provided by the Planning Department and City graphics art staff.


b. The expansion of the on-going Mid-City Historic Resources Survey (the "Survey") to include an area of Uptown that was to be included in the original survey, but later was deleted due to the Community Development Grant Block ("CDBG") allocation for the project. This would be a fifteen thousand dollar (\$15,000) project, in which nine thousand dollars (\$9,000) would come from the Program, and the City's forty percent (40%) match of six thousand dollars

(\$6,000) would consist of the CDBG monies currently allocated for the Survey.

2. That it authorizes the use of the required forty percent (40%) local matching funds and in-kind services for the projects as identified above.
