BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council, for and on behalf of the people of San Diego, hereby expresses its desire to be a Sister City to Warsaw Province and accepts the invitation of the Governor of Warsaw Province, the Honorable Bohdan Jastrzebski, to seek Sister City affiliation together.
