WHEREAS, Malcolm X's commitment to his people, the struggle for racial and ethnic dignity will always be a monument and memorial to our youth; and

WHEREAS, The City of San Diego is honored to have named the largest regional library and performing arts center in the City after this slain martyr; and

WHEREAS, in honoring the legacy of Malcolm X, we honor the "best in ourselves;" NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council, for and on behalf of the people of San Diego, does hereby dedicate the San Diego City Library Valencia Park Branch as the Malcolm X Library and Performing Arts Center.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that January 6, 1996 be and is hereby proclaimed to be "MALCOLM X LIBRARY AND PERFORMING ARTS DAY" in The City of San Diego.
