

RESOLUTION NUMBER R-287488

ADOPTED ON JUNE 10, 1996

WHEREAS, the Public Safety & Neighborhood Services Committee at its meeting on April 10, 1996 directed changes to be made to the City's current parking meter system, including updating of the meters to accept multiple denominations of coins and prepaid electronic cards or devices, in conformance with City Manager's Report No. 96-81; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the Council hereby approves City Manager's Report No. 96-81 regarding the conversion of parking meters to electronic meters which accept multiple denominations of coins and prepaid electronic card devices, with the exception of the proposed in-vehicle punch card option.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council affirms the City's two-year commitment for the complete conversion of parking meters within two years; the meters to be physically converted within one year for an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Manager is hereby directed to:

1. Proceed with a five-year lease purchase option for parking meters at a cost of \$245,000 per year.
2. Work with appropriate Business Improvement Districts, the Redevelopment Agency, Council and staff to establish parking meter districts and to determine an equitable plan for revenue derived from parking meters.


3. Draft a Council Policy for review at the earliest possible date by the Public Safety & Neighborhood Services Committee, which policy should allocate parking meter revenue among the General Fund, the Urban Super Fund (if created by City Council in the future), and the Parking Meter Districts in which the revenue is created, with allocation to be phased-in over a three-year period, and which should also include a plan for funding meter conversion from parking meter district allocations.

4. Return the matter to City Council on June 24, 1996 when Council will deliberate on the budget.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council will review the program at the end of two years, to ascertain possible interest of other business districts.
