RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 288269

ADOPTED ON JAN 27 1997

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego, via the San Diego Police Department, wishes to apply for, and if selected, to accept, expend, and execute a grant award from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services, under the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994, called COPS Universal Hiring, the purpose of which is to provide partial funding for new police officers to augment Community Policing; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the City Manager be and is hereby authorized and empowered, for and on behalf of the City of San Diego, to accept grant funding for the program under the standard terms and conditions as previous Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 hiring grants, to wit that said grants shall provide a total of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000.00) per new officer hired over a three year period, and the City shall be responsible for the balance of costs associated with these officers, currently approximately eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000.00) over the three year period;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council hereby authorizes the City Manager, for and on behalf of the City of San Diego, to

enter into an agreement with the United States Department of Justice to expend and manage grant funds for the above-named program;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to execute said grant agreement, and that this authority shall include all aspects of program operation and expenditures, under the terms and conditions of the approved grant program, including any amendments or extensions thereof, and to certify that the City comply with all applicable statutory and regulatory requirements related to said grant program;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Manager is authorized to provide all matching funds as required under this program;

BE IT further RESOLVED, that personnel positions funded by this grant award are not subject to local hiring freezes.
