WHEREAS, the Daughters of Isis, Isis Court No. 104, was originally composed of young mothers that were generally housewives and domestic workers; and

WHEREAS, today the Daughters of Isis are a non-profit charitable organization which consists of 92 African American women who have progressed from homemakers to women that personify loyalty and hard work towards the African American community; and

WHEREAS, the Daughters of Isis conducts Diabetic Information clinics; gives food and clothing to the homeless shelters and drug rehabilitation programs, such as The House of Metamorphosis; and contributes food baskets to underprivileged children and distressed families during both Christmas and Thanksgiving; and

WHEREAS, this year, the Daughters of Isis have assisted in the San Diego community by holding The Gospel Fest; Black History programs for the senior citizens; youth forums for teenagers and young adults in job skill preparation; Scholastic Aptitude Testing; test taking skills; and computer training; and

WHEREAS, in October the Daughters of Isis will award two \$500 scholarships to African American undergraduate students; and


WHEREAS, the Daughters of Isis' goal is to make a positive impact on the African American community, and in June they will be celebrating fifty years of existence in San Diego;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council, for and on behalf of the people of San Diego commends the Daughters of Isis, Isis Court No. 104 for paving a road for our youth of San Diego, and helping to make this world a better place for all.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that June 8, 1997, is hereby proclaimed to be "**THE DAUGHTERS OF ISIS, ISIS COURT NO. 104 DAY**" in The City of San Diego.
