WHEREAS, observance of the Twentieth Anniversary of Cultural Celebration of the College now and hereafter known as Thurgood Marshall College and the ideals of togetherness, respect, ethnic diversity, unity and a peaceful world view stand strong; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council, declare  
that Saturday, April 4, 1998, be widely and forever known as "**Thurgood Marshall College's  
Cultural Celebration Day**" in The City of San Diego.
