WHEREAS, hundreds of San Diego citizens and decision-makers agree that a statue honoring Kate Sessions's contributions to the development of Balboa Park and to the quality of life in all of San Diego is long overdue; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that this Council, for and on behalf of the citizens of San Diego, does hereby recognize the remarkable accomplishments, life and legacy of Kate Sessions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the month of April, 1998 is hereby proclaimed to be "Kate Sessions Month" in The City of San Diego.
