WHEREAS, Do Something, Inc. was founded in 1993 by a group of young people to make a positive impact on America's communities through leadership training, guidance and financial resources; and

WHEREAS, Do Something began its first west coast chapter in San Diego in January 1998 to help make San Diego a more livable city with stronger families, safer neighborhoods, better schools, more effective government and better economic opportunities for all its residents; and

WHEREAS, San Diego Do Something's mission is to help train, fund and mobilize young people to be leaders in their community who measurably strengthen their neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, San Diego Do Something during its Community Strengthening Week, May 11-16, 1998 will implement a youth-driven community service project including 27 Kearny High School students leading the effort to clean up a neighborhood in Linda Vista, 15 San Diego High School students began a food drive and distributed food to the homeless near Center City East, and 15 Southwest High School students helped clean up their neighborhood and educate their peers about littering in San Ysidro; NOW, THEREFORE,
