RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 290553 ADOPTED ON AUG 0 3 1998

WHEREAS, on June 21, 1994, the City of San Diego ("City") and the San Diego Unified Port District ("District") entered into a Memorandum of Understanding respecting the expansion of the San Diego Convention Center ("Expansion Project"); and

WHEREAS, on February 20, 1996, the City Council ("Council"), by Resolution No. R-286956, approved and authorized the City Manager to enter into a contract, the form of which is on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR-286956-2, to establish the design and construction of the Project with Golden Turner (the "Design Build Contract"); and

WHEREAS, to accomplish the construction of the Expansion Project, the City entered into certain agreements with the Convention Center Expansion Financing Authority ("Financing Authority") whereby the District would lease the existing Convention Center and the Expanded Center to the Financing Authority, the Financing Authority would issue lease revenue bonds to finance the construction of the Expansion Project and would award a construction contract, and the Financing Authority would then lease the Existing Center and Expanded Center to the City for a consideration sufficient to pay the debt financing on the lease revenue bonds; and

WHEREAS, the lease revenue financing mechanism, and the ability of the Financing Authority to utilize that mechanism, have been challenged in court by Richard Rider and others ("Rider v. City"); and

WHEREAS, the decision of the California Supreme Court in <u>Rider v. City</u> is pending; and

WHEREAS, because of the delay occasioned by <u>Rider v. City</u>, the City and the District agreed upon an alternative financing mechanism to accomplish this end, and have approved the financing documents necessary for accomplishing this financing through the execution and delivery of Certificates of Participation (the "Certificates"); and

WHEREAS, the delay and the need to prepare for either method of financing to be used has increased the efforts required from the City's Financial Advisor on this project, Public Financial Management, Inc./Municipal Capital Management, Inc. (PFM/MCM), and the costs of PFM/MCM's services in connection from this project; and

WHEREAS, certain additional administrative acts are necessary to carry out the Council's previously approved plan for expansion of the Convention Center; and

WHEREAS, it is the express intention of the City Council that any documents attached as Exhibits hereto, incorporated herein by reference or on file in the Office of the City Clerk comprise, together with the text of this Resolution, the full action of the Council and are necessary for a full understanding of the Council's actions; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized to enter into a Fourth Amendment to the Agreement between the City and PFM/MCM for financial advisory services related to the Convention Center Expansion, the form of which is on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR290553, increasing the compensation to be paid to PFM/MCM under the contract in an amount not to exceed \$34,000, inclusive of fees and expenses.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Auditor and Comptroller is hereby authorized to appropriate and expend, from available funds identified by the City Auditor and Comptroller, an amount up to \$34,000, as may be required for the funding of this Fourth

Amendment to the Agreement, with the intent that such funding may be reimbursed from future project funding sources, such as bond proceeds and Port District contributions.
