A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO ADOPTING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DEFERRED COMPENSATION PLAN TO COMPLY WITH THE SMALL BUSINESS JOB PROTECTION ACT OF 1996.

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego implemented a Deferred Compensation Plan dated November 29, 1973, permitting employees to defer a portion of their compensation to provide for retirement, disability, and death benefits in accordance with Sections 53212-53214 of the California Government Code and Section 457 of the Internal Revenue Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan was subsequently amended on May 30, 1974, July 23, 1979, and February 27, 1989 to comply with tax law changes; and

WHEREAS, the Small Business Job Protection Act of 1996, Public Law Number 104188, requires that eligible deferred compensation plans established and maintained by
governmental employers be amended by January 1, 1999, to provide that all assets of the Plan be
held in trust, or under an appropriate annuity contract or custodial account, for the exclusive
benefit of Plan participants and their beneficiaries; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego that the Plan is hereby amended to provide that, in accordance with Section 457(g) of the Internal Revenue Code, all amounts of compensation deferred pursuant to the Plan, all property and rights purchased with such amounts, and all income attributable to such amounts, property, or rights shall be held in one or more annuity contracts, as defined in section 401(g) of the Internal Revenue Code, issued by an insurance company qualified to do business in the State of California, for the exclusive

under the Plan shall be transferred to an annuity contract described in Section 401(f) of the Internal Revenue Code within a period that is no longer than is reasonable for the proper administration of the accounts of participants. To comply with this requirement, all amounts of compensation deferred under the Plan shall be transferred to an annuity contract described in Section 401(f) of the Internal Revenue Code not later than 15 business days after the end of the month in which the compensation would otherwise have been paid to the employee. Said amendment shall be shown in the City of San Diego Deferred Compensation Plan in an amended and restated plan document on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document Number R231048. The Amendment to the City of San Diego Deferred Compensation Plan is hereby adopted.

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# CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE OF

## SAN DIEGO CONVENTION CENTER CORPORATION

as amended February 18, 1998

#### 1. Standard Code of FPPC

The Political Reform Act of 1974 (Government Code section 81000, et seq.) requires each state and local government agency to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest code. The San Diego Convention Center Corporation has heretofore adopted such a code. The Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) has promulgated a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. Sec. 18730) which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code and can be incorporated by reference as an agency's code. After public notice and hearing the regulation may be amended by the FPPC to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act.

### 2. <u>Adoption of Standard Code of FPPC</u>

The terms of 2 California Code of Regulations section 18730 and any future amendments thereto duly adopted by the FPPC are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the Appendix attached hereto designating officials and employees and establishing disclosure categories shall constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the San Diego Convention Center Corporation. This code shall take effect when approved by the City of San Diego and shall thereupon supersede all prior codes adopted by San Diego Convention Center Corporation.

## 3. <u>Filing of Statements of Economic Interests</u>

Pursuant to Section 4 of the standard code, designated officials and employees set forth in Column 1 of **Appendix A**, attached hereto, shall file statements of economic interests, with the Secretary of the San Diego Convention Center Corporation, disclosing interests, investments or positions in, or income derived from the types of business or real estate set forth in the disclosure

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categories listed in Column 2 of Appendix A. Upon receipt of the statements, the Secretary shall make and retain copies and forward the originals of these statements to the City of San Diego.
