## RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 291106 ADOPTED ON DEC 0 8 1998

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO CERTIFYING THAT THE COUNCIL HAS REVIEWED AND CONSIDERED INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE MASTER ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT FOR THE CENTRE CITY REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT AND THE SECONDARY STUDY WITH RESPECT TO CENTRE CITY DEVELOPMENT/CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT 98-0357 (MUSIC VILLAGE), AND MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND DETERMINATIONS REGARDING ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS OF THE DEVELOPMENT PURSUANT THERETO.

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Agency of The City of San Diego (the "Agency") is engaged in activities necessary to carry out and implement the Redevelopment Plan for the Centre City Redevelopment Project (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Agency has previously prepared, and the Agency by Resolution

No. 2081 and the Council of the City of San Diego (the "Council") by Resolution No. R-279875

have certified the Final Master Environmental Impact Report for the Centre City Redevelopment

Project (referred to herein as the "MEIR); and

WHEREAS, the Council proposes to approve Centre City Development Permit 98-0357, a mixed-use project located at 1041-49 Fifth Avenue/1040-60 Sixth Avenue within the block bounded by Broadway, 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue, C Street and 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Centre City Development Corporation, Inc. ("CCDC"), acting on behalf of the Agency and the City Council, has prepared a Secondary Study in accordance with and pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970 ("CEQA"), as amended, and State

and local regulations and guidelines adopted pursuant thereto, and such Secondary Study assesses the environmental impacts of the development of the real property, and

WHEREAS, the Council has considered the environmental effects of the proposed development as shown in the MEIR, as supplemented by the Secondary Study; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

- 1. That it certifies that the MEIR and the Secondary Study of environmental impacts with respect to the proposed development permits have been prepared and completed in compliance with the CEQA Act of 1970, as amended, and State and local regulations and guidelines adopted pursuant thereto.
- 2. That it further certifies that the information in the Secondary Study has been reviewed and considered by the members of the Council.
  - 3. That it finds and determines that:
- a. No substantial changes are proposed in the Centre City

  Redevelopment Project, or with respect to the circumstances under which the Project is to be undertaken.
- b. No new information of substantial importance to the Project has become available which was not known or could not have been known at the time the MEIR for the Project was certified as complete, and which shows that the Project will have any significant effects not discussed previously in the MEIR, or that any significant effects previously examined will be substantially more severe than shown in the MEIR, or that any mitigation measures or alternatives previously found not to be feasible or not previously considered would substantially reduce lessen significant effects of the Project on the environment.

- c. The development permit will have no significant effect on the environment, except as identified and considered in the MEIR for the Project.
- d. No negative declaration, or subsequent environmental impact report, or supplement or addendum to the MEIR is necessary or required.
