

RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 291200

ADOPTED ON JAN 19 1999

WHEREAS, on September 8, 1998, the City Manager submitted a proposal for restructuring the City's Business Centers; and

WHEREAS, included in that proposal was a recommendation to move the Neighborhood Code Compliance Division [NCCD] from the Community and Neighborhood Services Business Center to the Police Business Center; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Employees Association [MEA] formally requested that the City meet and confer on all issues regarding wages, hours and working conditions that would be affected by the proposed move; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager's office, the Police Department and the NCCD have met and conferred with the MEA and AFSCME, Local 127 and have resolved many of the questions and concerns raised concerning wages, hours and other terms and conditions of employment that may be affected by the proposed move; and

WHEREAS, the transition process will begin on February 8, 1999, and will be completed by February 2000. Sixty-five (65) budgeted positions will be incorporated into the Police Business Center during this transition period; and

WHEREAS, representatives of the City Manager's office, the Police Business Center and the NCCD will continue to meet and confer with the employee organizations during the twelve (12) month transition period to insure that a satisfactory resolution is reached regarding all

matters within the scope of representation; and

WHEREAS, City staff also met with community organizations regarding the impact on community services that might occur as a result of the proposed change, and have resolved issues of concern with the community groups; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the City Manager's recommendations on the proposal to incorporate Neighborhood Code Compliance Division into the Police Business Center, as set forth in City Manager Report No. 99-08 to the Honorable Mayor and City Council on said subject, be and the same is hereby accepted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Council hereby directs the City Attorney to prepare the necessary amendments to the San Diego Municipal Code.
