Project/Program

The problem SSP addresses is the lack of awareness of elder abuse or neglect and the available resources for senior citizens. The focus of this project is prevention and early intervention as well as education of elder abuse and neglect. A study conducted by the National Center on Elder Abuse estimates that only one out of every 14 domestic elder abuse incidents are reported. Nationally, this works out to about 4.1 million elderly being abused each year and approximately 574,000 cases reported. In San Diego, this works out to 5,418 elderly being abused with 387 cases reported. It is clear that the elderly in this country are unaware of the recourse, intervention and prevention of elder abuse. Elder abuse victims, like domestic violence victims prior to awareness campaigns, fear retaliation, losing contact with family members, guilt, shame, isolation, or displacement from their own home if they report the abuse or neglect. They are often unaware that the police can or care to intervene or believe the problem they are experiencing is not a crime. The purpose for the requested funding is to disseminate information about the resources available to senior citizens, their rights and legal recourse if needed.

The Domestic Violence Unit of City Attorney's Office currently has a grant funded experienced attorney assigned to elder abuse. As an extension of that grant project, the City Attorney proposes the creation of SSP, a coordinated elder abuse prevention and early intervention program. The SSP entails four major components: 1) the referral process, 2) the internal operation of the project, 3) the caregiver programs and support groups, and 4) the referral of eligible cases for prosecution.

The City Attorney's Office has the unique qualification of having the authority to enforce Penal Code section 270c to effectively implement the SSP. One of the purposes of SSP is to provide the elder care providers who may be in violation of the Penal Code section 270c with the opportunity to change their behavior to appropriate care giving through education and skill building. Having the authority to enforce this Penal Code ensures that caregivers who do not change their behavior will be prosecuted.

Dissemination

The senior citizen community of the City of San Diego will receive information about elder abuse as well as the impact the Safe Seniors Project has had on their community through the funding provided by the San Diego Foundation. The agencies that provide services to the senior citizen community will also receive the ongoing information as well as the results of the Safe Senior Project. Finally, the Office of Criminal Justice Planning will also receive the ongoing progress reports as well as the final report on the Safe Seniors Project.

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
Revised Budget

The \$10,000 provided by the San Diego Foundation will assist in the dissemination of information to the senior citizens of the City of San Diego about the elder abuse and neglect problems and solutions and services available to senior citizens. The funding would cover the expense of the design and printing of brochures. The funding will also cover the expense of a freelance writer who has extensive knowledge and writing experience with elder issues.
