WHEREAS, the LEA may, upon majority vote of it local governing body, prescribe, revise, and collect fees or other charges from each operator of solid waste facility or from any person who conducts solid waste handling pursuant to Public Resources Code section 43213; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted a fee schedule on April 7, 1998 with the intent of recovering the complete costs associated with the Local Enforcement Agency's [LEA] regulatory duties; and

WHEREAS, the LEA seeks to revise its fee schedule in accordance with City Council direction while still maintaining its ability to recover complete costs associated with its regulatory duties; and

WHEREAS, the LEA seeks to reduce the annual Standardized Permit fee for Green

Waste Composting Facilities thereby distinguishing their type of permit fee from a full Solid

Waste Facility Permit; and

WHEREAS, the LEA seeks to eliminate quarterly reporting requirements and tonnage fee invoicing to conserve resources for both industry and the LEA; and

WHEREAS, the LEA seeks to replace the tonnage fees for waste haulers with an annual fee per vehicle thereby equitably and proportionally distributing these costs among all waste haulers operating within the City;

WHEREAS, On August 4, 1999, the Natural Resources and Culture Committee approved the proposed changes to the LEA fee schedule as described in City Manager's Report 99-164;

WHEREAS, San Diego Municipal Code section 66.0503 authorizes revisions to the fee schedule by, resolution, upon a majority vote of the City Council; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that the revisions to the Solid Waste Local Enforcement Agency [LEA] fee schedule set forth in Attachment A are accepted and approved.

TERM OF PERMIT. The term of a permit shall be a one year period from July 1 through June 30, inclusively. The term of a new permit shall be from the date of issuance through the following June 30.

PAYMENT OF FEES AND RECORD-KEEPING.

- A. Permit application fees shall be paid to the enforcement agency immediately upon the filing of any solid waste facility or waste collector permit application, or upon the filing of an application for a revision or modification of an existing permit.
- B. Regulatory services fees shall be made payable to the "City of San Diego" within 30 days following the due date. Whenever an annual permit fee or tonnage rate fee is required to be paid and such fees are 30 days past due, such fees shall be delinquent and an additional sum equal to 20% of the fee shall be imposed for such a delinquency, with an additional 1% per month thereafter. Such additional sums shall become a part of the fee required by the LEA.
- C. Payment of regulatory service fees, if based upon tonnage, shall be accompanied by a statement from the solid waste facility operator specifying and certifying the total amount of tonnage or volume of solid waste received during the preceding quarter.
 - Documentation substantiating the tonnage/volume upon which the solid waste regulatory fee is assessed shall be maintained by the operator and submitted quarterly for review to the enforcement agency.
- D. Each solid waste facility shall provide access to the enforcement agency for the purpose of monitoring or verifying the accuracy of the information submitted by the operator in the determination of the permit or regulatory fees.
- E. The fee for items not listed in the above fee schedule shall be determined by the actual costs incurred by the LEA. The LEA technical staff hourly rate is \$80.00 per hour (minimum charge, one hour, with each additional ½ hour being \$40.00).

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
