AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. O-18667 (NEW SERIES), AS AMENDED, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1999-2000 AND APPROPRIATING THE NECESSARY MONEY TO OPERATE THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR" BY AMENDING DOCUMENT NO. OO-18667 TO ADD THE POSITION OF PARKING OPERATIONS PROGRAM MANAGER IN THE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT, AND EXEMPTING SAID POSITION FROM THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE.

WHEREAS, on February 3, 2000, the Civil Service Commission reviewed a request of the Transportation Department to exempt a Parking Operations Program Manager Position from the classified service; and

WHEREAS, this position will be responsible for planning, administering, budgeting, organizing, directing, and policy formulation associated with managing Parking Operations; for sustaining revenue generation of about \$20 million annually; ensuring the achievement or organizational goals and measures of effectiveness in operation areas; for problem resolution of parking issues within the City of San Diego; for coordinating with other City departments and appropriate local, state and federal agencies, as well as private and community interests; and making recommendations concerning parking policies associated with the San Diego Municipal Code and the California Vehicle Code; and

WHEREAS, the Civil Service Commission has reviewed the justification for the position

and has commented favorably thereon in its memo to the Mayor and Council dated February 9, 2000; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend the armual appropriation ordinance to add said position to the Transportation Department; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. O-18667 as amended, entitled "AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1999-2000 AND APPROPRIATING THE NECESSARY MONEY TO OPERATE THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR" be and the same is hereby amended by amending Document No. OO-18667, by adding the position of Parking Operations Program Manager to the budget of the Transportation Department.

Section 2. That pursuant to section 117(a)17 of the City Charter, after having been reviewed and commented upon favorably by the Civil Service Commission on February 3, 2000, as meeting the Charter criterion for exemption from the classified service, and after having considered and reviewed the report thereon from the Civil Service Commission to the Mayor and Council dated February 9, 2000 attached hereto as Attachment A, the position of Parking Operations Program Manager in the Transportation Department be and is hereby exempted from the classified service and declared to be in the unclassified service of The City of San Diego.

Section 3. That a fill reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to its final passage, a written or printed copy having been available to the City Council and the public a day prior to its final passage.

Section 4. This ordinance is declared to take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage after two public hearings pursuant to the authority contained in sections 16, 17 and 71 of the Charter of The City of San Diego.

Exemption of a Parking Operations Program Manager position from the

Classified Service

On February 3, 2000, the Civil Service Commission reviewed a request of the Transportation Department Director to exempt a Parking Operations Program Manager position from the Classified Service. Under the direction of the Transportation Director and Deputy Director, this position will be responsible for the planning, policy formulation and evaluation, and administering the City's Parking Operations including parking enforcement and the meter operation. This position will also be responsible for making recommendations concerning parking policies associated with the Municipal Ordinance and the California Vehicle Code.

Charter Section 117 states that the Unclassified Service shall include "managerial employees having significant responsibilities for formulating and administering department policies and programs. Each such position shall be exempted from the Classified Service by ordinance, upon the initiation of the appropriate appointing authority and after receiving the advisory review and comment of the Civil Service Commission and approval of the City Council."

Upon review of the duties and responsibilities of this position, the Commission finds that it meets the intent of Charter Section 117. If additional information would be of assistance in your consideration of this matter, staff is available to respond with details as necessary.
