WHEREAS, she moved to San Diego in 1977 and resided at the Lakeshore Villa Apartments until 1997, when she moved to her daughter's home in Del Cerro; and

WHEREAS, Maude is retired from Yale University, a member of the Southeastern

Community Church, a founding member of The Girls of San Diego, a supportive member of Las

Munecas Auxiliary of the Children's Home Society; NOW, THEREFORE,
