Mitigated Negative Declaration

SUBJECT:

Sewer & Water Group 658. The proposed project consists of the replacement of sewer and water mains, laterals, and manholes and related improvements within portions of Bermuda Avenue, Pescadero Avenue, Orchard Avenue, Venice Street, Froude Street and several unnamed alleys within the area bounded by the Bermuda Avenue, Orchard Avenue, Catalina Boulevard, and the coastline, within the Ocean Beach and Peninsula Community Planning Areas of the City of San Diego. The installation of approximately 9,050 lineal feet of 8-inch diameter sewer mains and approximately 860 lineal feet of 8-inch diameter water mains within both existing and new trenches is proposed. Applicant: City of San Diego Engineering & Capital Projects Department.

- I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION: See attached Initial Study.
- II. ENVIRONMENTAL SETTING: See attached Initial Study.
- III. DETERMINATION:

The City of San Diego conducted an Initial Study which determined that the proposed project could have a significant environmental effect. Subsequent revisions in the project proposal create the specific mitigation identified in Section V of this Mitigated Negative Declaration. The project as revised now avoids or mitigates the potentially significant environmental effects previously identified, and the preparation of an Environmental Impact Report will not be required.

IV. DOCUMENTATION:

The attached Initial Study documents the reasons to support the above determination.

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V. MITIGATION, MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM:

Cultural Resources

Prior to the preconstruction meeting, the applicant shall provide a letter of verification to the Environmental Review Manager of Land Development Review (LDR) stating that a qualified archaeologist and/or archaeological monitor, as defined in the City of San Diego Historical Resources Guidelines, have been retained to implement the monitoring program. The requirement for archaeological monitoring shall be noted on the grading plans. ALL PERSONS INVOLVED IN THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL MONITORING OF THIS PROJECT SHALL BE APPROVED BY LDR PRIOR TO THE START OF MONITORING. THE APPLICANT SHALL NOTIFY LDR OF THE START AND END OF CONSTRUCTION.

- a. The qualified archaeologist shall attend any preconstruction meetings to make comments and/or suggestions concerning the archaeological monitoring program with the construction manager.
- b. The qualified archaeologist or archaeological monitor shall be present on site full-time during grading of native soils, not including geologic formational material, within the following proposed sewer and water main trenches and connecting laterals as identified on the "D" Sheets for Sewer & Water Group 658 (28475):
 - i. Sheet 5, between Station 1+00 and Station 4+00.
 - ii. Sheet 6, between Station 4+00 and Station 8+00.
 - iii. Sheet 7, between Station 8+00 and Station 8+50.
 - iv. Sheet 12, between Station 28+00 and Station 31+54.
 - v. Sheet 13, between Station 1+00 and Station 4+00.
 - vi. Sheet 14, between Station 4+00 and Station 8+00.
 - vii. Sheet 15, between Station 8+00 and Station 11+00.
 - viii. Sheet 16, between Station 13+00 and Station 16+00.
 - ix. Sheet 17, between Station 16+00 and Station 20+00
 - x. Sheet 18, between Station 20+00 and Station 23+00.
 - xi. Sheet 21, between Station 1+00 and Station 3+89.
 - xii. Sheet 22, between Station 3+89 and Station 6+50.
 - xiii. Sheet 23, between Station 1+00 and Station 3+96.

- xiv. Sheet 24, between Station 1+00 and Station 2+32.
- xv. Sheet 27, between Station 1+00 and Station 4+78.
- xvi. Sheet 28, between Station 1+00 and Station 4+22.
- xvii. Sheet 29, between Station 1+60 and Station 2+70.
- WHEN REQUESTED BY THE ARCHAEOLOGIST, THE CITY C. RESIDENT ENGINEER SHALL DIVERT, DIRECT, OR TEMPORARILY HALT GROUND DISTURBANCE ACTIVITIES IN THE AREA OF DISCOVERY TO ALLOW EVALUATION OF POTENTIALLY SIGNIFICANT CULTURAL RESOURCES. THE ARCHAEOLOGIST SHALL IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY LDR STAFF OF SUCH FINDING AT THE TIME OF DISCOVERY. The significance of the discovered resources shall be determined by the archaeologist, in consultation with LDR and the Native American community. LDR must concur with the evaluation before grading activities will be allowed to resume. For significant cultural resources, a Research Design and Data Recovery Program shall be prepared and carried out to mitigate impacts before grading activities in the area of discovery will be allowed to resume. Any human bones of Native American origin shall be turned over to the appropriate Native American group for reburial.
- d. All cultural materials collected shall be cleaned, catalogued, and permanently curated with an appropriate institution. All artifacts shall be analyzed to identify function and chronology as they relate to the history of the area. Faunal material shall be identified as to species and specialty studies shall be completed, as appropriate.
- e. Within three months following the completion of grading, a monitoring results report and/or evaluation report, if appropriate, which describes the results, analysis, and conclusions of the archaeological monitoring program (with appropriate graphics) shall be submitted to and approved by the Environmental Review Manager of LDR. For significant cultural resources, a Research Design and Data Recovery Program shall be included as part of the evaluation report. A mitigation report for significant cultural resources, if required, shall be submitted (within three months following the completion of grading) to and approved by the Environmental Review Manager of LDR.

Paleontological Resources

Prior to the preconstruction meeting, the applicant shall provide a letter of verification to the Environmental Review Manager of Land Development Review (LDR) stating that a qualified paleontologist and/or paleontological monitor, as defined in the City of San Diego Paleontological Guidelines, have been retained to implement the monitoring program. The requirement for paleontological monitoring shall be noted on the grading plans. ALL PERSONS INVOLVED IN THE PALEONTOLOGICAL MONITORING OF THIS PROJECT SHALL BE APPROVED BY LDR PRIOR TO THE START OF MONITORING. THE APPLICANT SHALL NOTIFY LDR OF THE START AND END OF CONSTRUCTION.

- a. The qualified paleontologist shall attend any preconstruction meetings to make comments and/or suggestions concerning the paleontological monitoring program with the construction manager.
- b. The paleontologist or paleontological monitor shall be on site full-time during the initial cutting of previously undisturbed areas (Where existing trenches are to be excavated, monitoring shall be required only where excavation would occur below the invert of the existing pipe.). Monitoring may be increased or decreased at the discretion of the qualified paleontologist, in consultation with LDR, and will depend on the rate of excavation, the materials excavated, and the abundance of fossils. Monitoring shall be conducted within the following proposed sewer main trenches and connecting laterals as identified on the "D" Sheets for Sewer & Water Group 658 (28475):
 - i. Sheet 5, between Station 1+00 and Station 4+00.
 - ii, Sheet 6, between Station 4+00 and Station 8+00.
 - iii. Sheet 13, between Station 1+00 and Station 4+00.
 - iv. Sheet 14, between Station 4+00 and Station 6+00.
 - v. Sheet 15, between Station 8+00 and Station 11+00.
 - vi. Sheet 24, between Station 1+00 and Station 2+32.
- c. WHEN REQUESTED BY THE PALEONTOLOGIST, THE CITY
 RESIDENT ENGINEER SHALL DIVERT, DIRECT, OR TEMPORARILY
 HALT CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES IN THE AREA OF DISCOVERY

TO ALLOW RECOVERY OF FOSSIL REMAINS. THE PALEONTOLOGIST SHALL IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY LDR STAFF OF SUCH FINDING AT THE TIME OF DISCOVERY. LDR shall approve salvaging procedures to be performed before construction activities are allowed to resume.

- d. The paleontologist shall be responsible for preparation of fossils to a point of identification as defined in the City of San Diego Paleontological Guidelines and submittal of a letter of acceptance from a local qualified curation facility. Any discovered fossil sites shall be recorded by the paleontologist at the San Diego Natural History Museum.
- e. Within three months following the completion of grading, a monitoring results report, with appropriate graphics, summarizing the results, analysis, and conclusions of the paleontological monitoring program shall be submitted to and approved by Environmental Review Manager of LDR.
