WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Wastewater Department recognizes the importance of protecting the water quality of San Diego's beaches and bays, and has opened the three and one-half mile South Bay Ocean Outfall which will handle sewage flows from the federal government's International Wastewater Treatment Plant and the new South Bay Water Reclamation Plant; NOW, THEREFORE,
