RESOLUTION NUMBER R- 234089 ADOPTED ON NOV 1 4 2000

WHEREAS, tobacco use kills more people in California each year than deaths due to alcohol, cocaine, crack, heroine, homicide, suicide, car accidents, fires and AIDS combined; and

WHEREAS, smoking remains the number one preventable cause of death and disease and most smokers become addicted when they are in their teens; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 300 youths begin smoking each day in California and one-third will die prematurely or incur a smoking-related illness; and

WHEREAS, Big Tobacco spends \$25 million annually in San Diego County alone to market its lethal and addictive product; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego City Council became the first government body to pass a model Youth Tobacco Ordinance that regulates in-store product placement and advertising as well as outside advertising and billboards; and

WHEREAS, the City Attorney's office works closely with local law enforcement agencies to enforce the City's ordinance; and

WHEREAS, local ordinances and other anti-tobacco campaigns, combined with a 50 cent tobacco tax increase approved by voters in 1998, have contributed to a 35% decline in youth smoking in California; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego City Council will continue in its efforts to fight Big Tobacco and reduce youth smoking; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that this Council hereby proclaims the week of November 13 through 18, 2000 as "Smoke-Free San Diego Week" in the City of San Diego.
