RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DECLARING A CONTINUED STATE OF EMERGENCY REGARDING A CRITICAL LOCAL PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS RELATED TO THE SPREAD OF THE HEPATITIS C VIRUS

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8630 authorizes local governing bodies to proclaim local emergencies when such events occur as are defined by California Government Code section 8558(c), provided further by Section 8630 that the local governing body must review the state of emergency at its regularly scheduled meetings or every twenty-one days until such emergency is declared to be terminated; and

WHEREAS, the City Council on October 16, 2000, adopted Resolution No. R-293966, declaring the existence of a state of emergency regarding a critical local public health crisis related to the spread of the hepatitis C virus; and

WHEREAS, there is a continued state of emergency regarding this public health crisis, and such continuing state of emergency must be declared by the City Council every twenty-one days or after legislative recess, as required by California Government Code section 8630; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, that pursuant to California Government Code section 8630, a continued state of emergency is declared to persist relative to a critical local public health crisis related to the spread of the hepatitis C virus.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the measures previously taken by the City Council in Resolution No. R-293966 shall continue to have full force and effect.
