WHEREAS, Eddie is an internationally recognized artist, whose paintings and murals adorn local elementary schools, Imperial Avenue in Encanto, and the First African Methodist Episcopal Church, one of the largest black churches in Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, his work was exhibited in San Diego's City Hall and in Washington, D.C., at the legislative conference of the Congressional Black Caucus Foundation; and

WHEREAS, Eddie works in all mediums he is especially noted for his excellence in earth tone oils and pastels and black and white renderings created with a soft lead pencil; NOW, THEREFORE,
