AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO AMENDING CHAPTER 14, ARTICLE 2, DIVISION 2, OF THE SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTIONS 142.0201, 142.0210 AND 142.0220, ALL RELATING TO DRAINAGE REGULATIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of The City of San Diego, as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 14, Article 2, Division 2, of the San Diego Municipal Code is

amended by amending Sections 142.0201, 142.0210, and 142.0220, to read as follows:

Article 2: General Development Regulations

Division 2: Storm Water Runoff and Drainage Regulations

§142.0201 Purpose of Drainage Regulations

The purpose of this division is to regulate the *development* of, and impacts to, drainage facilities, to limit water quality impacts from *development*, to minimize hazards due to *flooding* while minimizing the need for construction of *flood* control facilities, to minimize impacts to *environmentally sensitive lands*, to implement the provisions of federal and state regulations, and to protect the public health, safety, and welfare.

§142.0210 Construction Standards

All storm water runoff control, drainage, and *flood* control facilities shall be constructed in accordance with standards established in the Land

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Development Manual, the Standard Specifications for Public Works, and any City-adopted supplements.

§142.0220 Storm Water Runoff Control

- (a) All *development* shall comply with Municipal Code Chapter 4,
 Article 3, Division 3 (Stormwater Management and Discharge Control).
- (b) All *development* shall be conducted to prevent erosion and stop sediment and pollutants from leaving the property to the maximum extent practicable. The property owner is responsible to implement and maintain temporary and permanent erosion, sedimentation, and water pollution control measures to the satisfaction of the City Manager, whether or not such measures are a part of approved plans. The property owner shall install, monitor, maintain, and revise these measures, as appropriate, to ensure their effectiveness. Controls shall include the following measures that address the *development*'s potential erosion, sedimentation, and water pollution impacts.
 - (1) Erosion prevention.
 - (2) Sediment control.
 - (3) Phased grading.

Section 2. That a full reading of this ordinance is dispensed with prior to its final passage, a written or printed copy having been available to the City Council and the

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public a day prior to its final passage.

Section 3. That outside the Coastal Overlay Zone, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force on the thirtieth day from and after its passage. Within the Coastal Overlay Zone, this ordinance shall be in force and effect on the date it is effectively certified by the California Coastal Commission as a City of San Diego Local Coastal Program amendment.

Section 4. That the City Manager is directed to forward to the Coastal Commission the amendments required to be certified as Local Coastal Program amendments.
