WHEREAS, bicycling is the most energy efficient form of transportation available and serves as an alternative to automobile use which helps to increase safety for pedestrians and other road users; and

WHEREAS, "Bike to Work Day" is a wonderful way to increase awareness of the value of biking to work rather than commuting in cars; NOW, THEREFORE,

encouraged to consider using alternative means of transportation including bicycles not only on this day but throughout the year.
