MITIGATION MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM

BEST BUY MIRA MESA

PLANNED DEVELOPMENT PERMIT NO. 40-0819/ MIRA MESA COMMUNITY PLAN AMENDMENT

LDR NO. 40-0819

This Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program is designed to ensure compliance with Public Resources Code Section 21081.6 during implementation of mitigation measures. This program identifies at a minimum: the department responsible for the monitoring, what is to be monitored, how the monitoring shall be accomplished, the monitoring and reporting schedule, and completion requirements. A record of the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program will be maintained at the offices of the Land Development Review Division, 1222 First Avenue, Fifth Floor, San Diego, CA 92101. The mitigation measure contained in the Mitigated Negative Declaration (LDR No. 40-0819) shall be made a condition of Planned Development Permit No. 40-0819 as may be further described below.

Water Quality

Prior to the issuance of any grading permit, comprehensive permanent post-construction water quality best management practices (BMPs), consistent with those shown on Exhibit "A" (site or grading plan), shall be incorporated into the project plans to reduce the amount of pollutants (e.g., oil, grease, heavy metals) and sediments discharged from the site, satisfactory to the City Engineer. BMPs shall include the use of an oil and water separator device and inlet filters as shown on Exhibit "A". Equivalent alternative technologies may be approved as BMPs by the City Engineer in lieu of, or in addition to, those shown on Exhibit "A". All permanent BMPs shall be maintained in accordance with the applicable manufacturer specifications. Spot checks may be made by the City Engineer to ensure that BMPs are being adequately maintained.
