WHEREAS, since 1998, she has assisted the Somalian community in San Diego as Coordinator of the Somali Youth & Education Center and with her work at the Aswan African Cafe; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Grant is a retired businesswoman who owned and operated the Ebony Inn Motel, the first African American owned motel in San Diego; and

WHEREAS, she is actively involved in the community as a producer of various pageants, fashion shows, and plays, a lecturer to senior citizens classes in public schools, a member of the Board of Citizens Council at the Educational Cultural Complex; and


