WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) has made available to the City of San Diego Police Department the Fiscal Year 2001/2002 Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (LLEBG) in the amount of \$2,393,470; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego wishes to apply for, accept and expend these grant funds; and

WHEREAS, the City of San Diego wishes to transfer \$900,000 from this grant to the County of San Diego to assist in funding the Drug Court Program; and

WHEREAS, the balance of these funds will be used for police automation, vehicle safety, laboratory, training and miscellaneous equipment, maintenance and resources which will contribute to the efficiency and safety of law enforcement and crime prevention services throughout San Diego; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the Chief of Police, on behalf of the City Manager, be and is hereby authorized and empowered for and on behalf of the City of San Diego, to apply for, accept and expend these block grant funds for the above-named purposes, and as described in the Grant Application Form, a copy of which is attached and on file in the Office of the City Clerk as Document No. RR- 295482

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council hereby authorizes the Chief of Police to execute all aspects of program operation, including any amendments, extensions, or renewals, for a period of up to five years, provided funding is made available by the U.S. Department of

Justice, and to certify that the City will comply with all applicable statutory or regulatory requirements related to said program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council hereby authorizes the City Auditor and the City Treasurer to transfer \$900,000 from these grant funds to the County of San Diego, to be used for the purpose of drug courts and/or other authorized purposes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief of Police be, and is hereby, authorized to commit the required matching funds in compliance with the requirements of the Local Law enforcement Block Grant program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resources received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body; and that personnel positions, if any, funded under this grant are not subject to local hiring freezes.
