A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY
OF SAN DIEGO AUTHORIZING THE APPLICATION
FOR AND EXPENDITURE OF STATE GRANT FUNDS
FOR NON-MOTORIZED TRAILS FOR FAMOSA SLOUGH TRAIL.

WHEREAS, the Safe Neighborhood Parks, Clean Water, Clean Air, and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2000 authorized the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation to administer the Non-Motorized Trails Grant Program to provide funds on a competitive basis for the development, improvement, restoration, and enhancement of trails and associated interpretive facilities to increase access to public areas and to increase recreational opportunities;

WHEREAS, the Famosa Slough Trail project, located on the west side of the Famosa Slough, meets the eligibility criteria for funding under the grant program in that the trail is located in a high density urban area, provides a natural habitat for interpretive and educational purposes, will create a safe trail for pedestrians with interpretive panels, a walkway and a small bridge, and will reroute informal trails farther away from the marsh edge to help protect sensitive habitat;

WHEREAS, if the grant is secured, the grant funds of \$60,200 will be applied to the project and the City will provide \$11,866 of in-kind work performed by volunteers; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:


1. That the Council authorizes the City Manager or designee to apply to the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation under the Non-Motorized Trails Grant Program for a grant for the Famosa Slough Trail project;

2. That the Council authorizes the City Manager or designee to take all necessary actions to secure and accept grant funds from the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation for the Famosa Slough Trail project, including negotiating and entering into a grant funding agreement;

3. That, if the grant funds are secured, the Council appropriates, and authorizes the City Manager or designee to expend the grant funds in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the grant funding agreement.

4. That, if the grant funds are secured, the Council authorizes the City Auditor and Comptroller to establish a special interest-bearing fund for the grant funds.
