San Diego which has grown to symbolize the excellence, promise and commitment San Diego's life science community has toward improving the quality of life; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that this Council, for and on behalf of the people of San Diego, does hereby proclaim the month of December 2001, to be "NOBEL LAUREATE MONTH" in San Diego.
