WHEREAS, the three current options under consideration for secondary treatment are conventional activated sludge, a completely mixed aerated pond system in San Diego, and a privately financed facility in Mexico; and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States signed the Tijuana River Valley Estuary and Beach Sewage Cleanup Act of 2000 on November 7, 2000, to provide for secondary treatment of effluent from the South Bay International Wastewater Treatment Plant in Mexico;
