RESOLUTION NUMBER R-296394

ADOPTED ON APRIL 22, 2002

WHEREAS, the San Diego City Council supports the Federal Wilderness designation for four areas within San Diego County: Eagle Peak Complex, Hauser Additions, Sawtooth Mountains Additions, and Carrizo Gorge Addition, and Federal Wild & Scenic River Designation for Three Rivers in San Diego County: San Diego River, Cedar Creek, and Pine Valley Creek; and

WHEREAS, these public, federal lands in the Cleveland National Forest and Bureau of Land Management include watersheds and rivers that provide our clean drinking water; and

WHEREAS, these natural lands and rivers offer residents a unique recreational experience of solitude, and provide visitors with an opportunity to escape from the development of civilization; and

WHEREAS, Wilderness and Wild & Scenic River designation provides the best and most permanent form of protection; and

WHEREAS, the Eagle Peak Complex (west of Cuyamaca Rancho State Park) consists of four proposed Wilderness units: San Diego River Gorge, Eagle Peak, No Name, and Sill Hill; and two proposed Wild & Scenic Rivers: San Diego River and Cedar Creek; and

WHEREAS, the Eagle Peak Complex will protect the San Diego River watershed and tributaries that provide our clean drinking water supply that is stored in El Capitan Reservoir; and

WHEREAS, Wilderness designation of this beautiful area with dramatic canyons, spectacular waterfalls, and deep pools in lush riparian woodlands will protect our American heritage; and

WHEREAS, the Hauser Additions (north of San Diego county's southern border) contain

two proposed Wilderness units: South Hauser and Hauser Mountain; and the proposed Wild & Scenic River, Pine Valley Creek; and

WHEREAS, the South Hauser area will help protect the critical watershed for Cottonwood Creek. South Hauser unit and Pine Valley Creek waters flow into Barrett Lake, a reservoir for San Diego's drinking water supply; and

WHEREAS, Hauser Mountain Wilderness designation will help provide wildlife linkages and corridors; and

WHEREAS, the Sawtooth Mountains Additions and Carrizo Gorge Addition are two proposed desert Wilderness areas (east of the Laguna Mountains); and

WHEREAS, these remarkable desert lands are contiguous to Anza Borrego Desert State

Park and protect many diverse plant and animal species; and

WHEREAS, Sawtooth Mountains and Carrizo Gorge Additions are the home of the endangered peninsular bighorn sheep; and

WHEREAS, these desert lands offer opportunities for solitude, primitive recreation, and inspiring views of the desert; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that this Council, for and on behalf of the people of San Diego, hereby proclaims April 22, 2002, as "California Wild Heritage" Day in the City of San Diego.
