## ADOPTED ON APR 3 0 2002

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF THE FY2003 CONSOLIDATED PLAN TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT.

WHEREAS, the City's Fiscal Year 2003 Consolidated Plan continues a new consolidated process for four U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development [HUD] housing and community development formula-based programs: Community Development Block Grant [CDBG], HOME Investment Partnerships [HOME], Emergency Shelter Grants [ESG], and Housing Opportunities for Persons with Aids [HOPWA]; and

WHEREAS, this process replaces all current HUD planning and application requirements with a single submission and satisfies the regulatory requirements for the four HUD formula programs; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Year 2003 Action Plan for Community Development provides the City with an opportunity to shape its programs supported by federal, state, and local funds, into a coordinated housing, economic development and human services strategy, and gives City officials and citizens a better single view of San Diego's community development plans on a citywide basis; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Year 2003 Action Plan for Community Development, the thirdyear update of the City's Five-Year Consolidated Plan, contains the overall strategy for the City's community revitalization efforts, and describes how these efforts will continue to be implemented through the City's commitment to bottom-up planning, an integrated approach to addressing community and neighborhood problems, support for partnering with our citizenry and the decentralization of decision making; and

WHEREAS, the Consolidated Annual Plan describes how the City is meeting statutory requirements of specified federal grant programs, which statutes set forth three basic goals, each of which must primarily benefit low- and very low-income persons: (1) to provide decent housing; (2) to provide a suitable living environment; and (3) to expand economic opportunities; and

WHEREAS, implementation of the City of San Diego's community development strategy will continue to rely on a multifaceted approach to providing livable neighborhoods and affordable housing for San Diegans, and a partnership comprised of the public sector, private sector, and nonprofit entities will utilize a combination of resources to finance affordable housing and economic development activities; and

WHEREAS, the City's Fiscal Year 2003 Action Plan for Community Development was developed by an interagency working committee composed of the San Diego Housing Commission, as the lead, the City's Community and Economic Development & Community Services Department, and the San Diego County's Department of Housing and Community Development; and

WHEREAS, the San Diego Housing Commission will continue to plan, coordinate, operate, administer, implement and draw down funds for operation of the HOME program, and the County of San Diego will continue to plan, coordinate, operate, administer, implement and draw down funds for operation of the HOPWA program, as previously authorized by the City

Council in prior resolutions, including but not limited to, Resolution Nos. R-284352 and R-286709, and the City's Community Services Division will continue to administer, implement and draw down funds for operation of the CDBG and ESG programs; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that the City's federally required Fiscal Year 2003 Action Plan for Community Development, the third year update of the City's Five-Year Consolidated Plan, a copy of which is on file in the office of the City Clerk as Document No. RQ 296420, is approved, and the Chief Executive Officer of the Housing Commission is authorized to submit the Plan, on behalf of the City, to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for its review and approval.
