RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SAN DIEGO DECLARING A CONTINUED STATE OF EMERGENCY DUE TO ECONOMIC CIRCUMSTANCES IN THE SAN DIEGO-TIJUANA BORDER REGION

WHEREAS, the Council finds that such emergency continues to exist in that area of the City of San Diego immediately adjacent to the United States-Mexico border; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that pursuant to California Government Code section 8630, a continued state of emergency is declared to exist in that area of the City of San Diego immediately adjacent to the United States-Mexico border, due to the economic circumstances in the San Diego-Tijuana border area.
